
## How many people are locked up in the United States?


The U.S. locks up more people per capita than any other nation, at the staggering rate of 698 per 100,000 residents. But to end mass incarceration, we must first consider *where* and *why* 2.3 million people are confined nationwide.



## **Pretrial Detention** Over 540,000 people are locked up who haven't even been convicted or sentenced Why? Many are detained in local jails because they cannot afford to pay the bail amount set to secure their release. Local jails The median bail amount for felonies is \$10,000, 462,000 which represents 8 months' income for a typical person detained because they can't pay bail. Youth 15,000 Psychiatric evaluation or treatment 9,000 Indian Country 1,100 Federal 51,000

## There are over 1 million drug possession arrests each year

There are 6 times as many arrests for drug possession as for drug sales. (Arrests in millions, 1980–2017)
